COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This is a two credit-hour course which is taken in the second year of the program. The course is to train the postgraduate student in comprehensive treatment planning of complicated pediatric dentistry cases, case analysis and oral/power point presentation.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this course is to provide the graduate student in Pediatric Dentistry with experience and discipline through case work-up, case analysis, and oral presentation.

OBJECTIVES:

- To enable the graduate student to document successful overall treatment planning which considered of high standard with high quality results as well as to demonstrate an ability to assess the physical and psychological health of the pediatric patient.
- To facilitate exchange of ideas regarding various approaches toward management of different cases and be able to discuss and support their options and approaches.
- To demonstrate knowledge of contemporary literature and ability to utilize it when describing/defending diagnosis and treatment plan.
- To develop confidence and experience in presenting and discussing their cases.

METHODOLOGY:

- Oral presentation of clinical cases before, during and after treatment according to the given format.
- Supporting their presentation with evidence based resources including scientific literature.

EVALUATION:

- Documentation, organization and quality of presentation.
- Response to questions and knowledge of the topic.
- Appropriate use of literature and use of evidence based resources.
- Contribution during discussion.
- Participation in assessments and assignments.
- In-course assessment, presentations and assignments 50 %
- Final written examination 50 %
