Nominal Sentences

- o Nominal sentences are sentences that have a linking verb (or copula) between the subject and the compliment.
- o Be , become , seem , appear , get, turn, grow, feel, look, smell, taste, sound
- o <u>Note:</u> Unlike Arabic nominal sentences, English nominal sentences contain verbs

- o She is a student at the school.
- o They seem upset because of what happened.
- o He appears to be interested in the conversation.
- o The food smells delicious.
- o The fruit looks fresh.
- o The sandwich tastes awful.

- o It sounds like they did not enjoy the trip.
- o The children feel happy.
- o The weather became cold.
- o The room got quiet when the teacher entered.
- o We grew tired as we were climbing the mountain.
- o The weather turns hot in July.
