III. Calculation:

1. Physician orders amoxicillin for a 5-year-old child. Usual adult dose is 500 mg. calculate the child's dose.

Child's dose = Adult's dose x child's age / (child's age + 12)

Child's dose = 500 x 5 / (5+12) --→ child's dose = 150 mg
