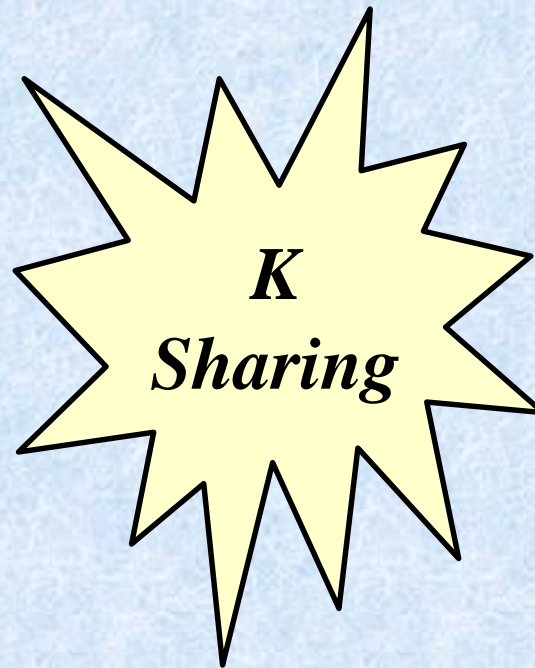

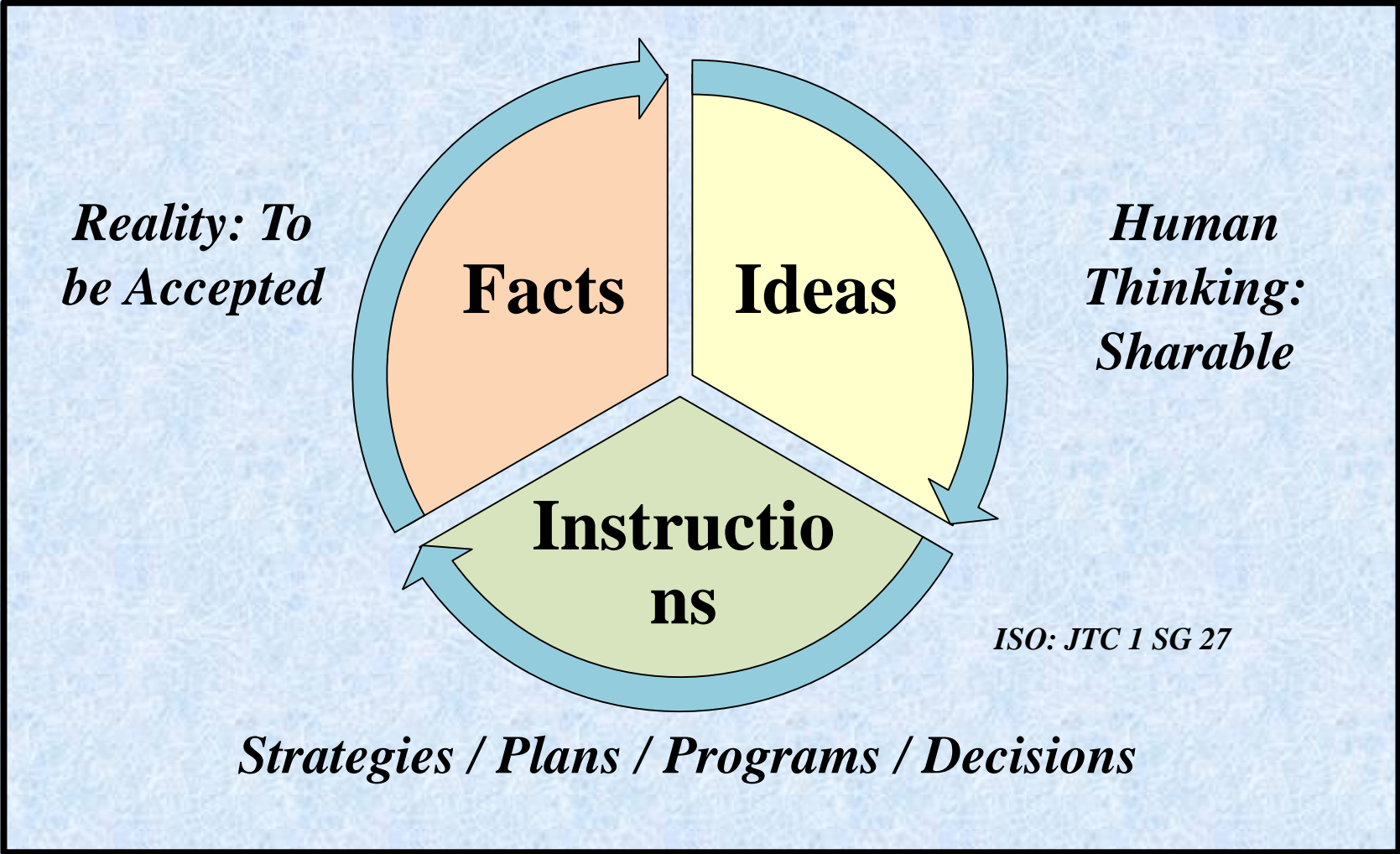

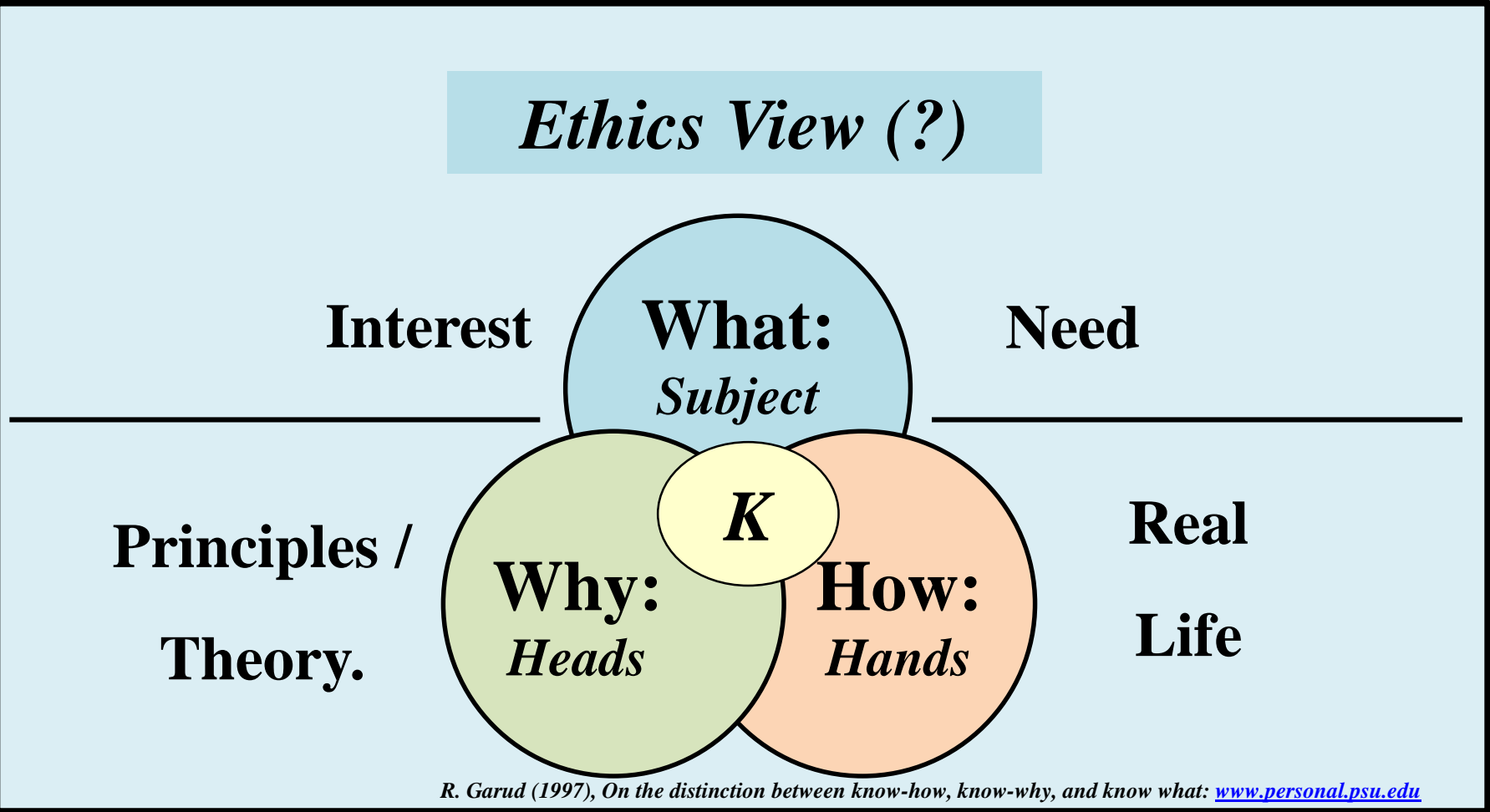

**A character to be “admired” “morally”, “intellectually”,
or in the “conduct (behavior) of specific affairs**
