### Active Voice, Passive Voice

There are two special forms for verbs called voice:

- 1. Active voice
- 2. Passive voice



The active voice is the "normal" voice. This is
the voice that we use most of the time. You
are probably already familiar with the active
voice. In the active voice, the object
receives the action of the verb:



• The passive voice is less usual. In the passive voice, the subject receives the action of the verb:

#### Use of the Passive Voice

- · We use the passive when:
- we want to make the active object more important

• we do not know the active subject

### ACTIVE OR PASSIVE?

- I ate a piece of chocolate cake.
- · The librarian read the book to the students.
- The money was stolen.

They are paid on Fridays.
