Course description:

This course is a survey of topics in the social and behavioral sciences as they apply to pharmacy practice. It is a part of a 2 course series that introduce the Medication Therapy Management service (MTMS) to optimize therapeutic outcomes through appropriate drug use, enhanced patient understanding of appropriate drug use, increased patient adherence with prescribed drug therapies, and reduced risk of adverse events associated with drugs.

Course objectives

- To give students a deeper and more detailed appreciation of how social and behavioral sciences are applied to problems in pharmacy, health, and illness.
- To provide students with skills required to understand and apply social and behavioural principles in the design, delivery and evaluation of pharmaceutical care.

Learning outcomes

After studying this course, the student is expected to be able to:

- 1. Discuss the importance of behavioral and social theories to pharmaceutical care practice and research
- 2. Describe relevant behavioral theories of health, illness and medication use, and apply these theories to the pharmacotherapy plan.
- 3. Identify and describe social and behavioral factors associated with medication nonadherence, and identify strategies to improve adherence.
- 4. Apply social and behavioral research to understand and improve pharmaceutical care.
- 5. Demonstrate sensitivity to the various multicultural factors involved in pharmaceutical care.
- 6. Display professional attitudes, beliefs and behaviors in the delivery of pharmaceutical care.

1. Article discussion (15 points)

The objective of this assignment

- 1. To understand how behavioral theories of health, illness and medication use are applied into research and practice.
- 2. The student should be able to differentiate culture differences between Saudi population and other population and how to apply such research in Saudi Arabia.

The assignment:

- 1. You will be divided to groups of 5-6 students, but each student will work individually.
- 2. Each group will be given an article related to one the theories in social pharmacy.
- 3. You are required to write a reflection and lead a discussion about this article.
- 4. Each student should work individually to review the article, critique it and write his own reflection on this article.
- 5. Discuss how does this research add to pharmacy, weak points and the strong points in this research, and what did this article add to your knowledge.

This assignment is two parts:

Part one a paper (9 out of 15 points)

A written reflection about 300 words long no more than one page. The paper must be typed, double-spaced, 12 font, and one-inch margins or they will not be accepted. Late papers will not be accepted. Students handing in papers late will automatically receive a grade of zero. The paper should be handed 48 hours before the discussion scheduled date.

The paper will be graded as follow: the 9 points will be divided

- 1. The clarity of the idea: (3 points)

 This paper reflects your own opinion it needs to be clear and well presented.
- 2. The content which should include: (5 points)
- The benefits of this research to pharmacy practice
- Weak points and the strong points in this research
- Culture differences that can be identified in this paper (for example limitations in applying this research in Saudi Arabia)
- What did this article add to your knowledge?
- 3. Spelling errors (1 points)

Part two in the class (6 out of 15 points)

As a team be ready to discuss your Article for the duration of 50 minutes. The discussion will be open with questions from the audience (the tutor and students)

- Start by providing a brief summary about the article
- · Evaluate the research method and study results
- Discuss the application of this kind of research in pharmacy practice
- Discuss how this theory can be developed and adapted in Saudi Arabia
- Answer questions from the audience

The discussion will be graded as follow:

Leading the discussion and the level of student involvement 3 points
Answering the discussion question 3 points

There will be a standard evaluation form to evaluate your discussion will be sent later.

2) Project (15 points)

The objectives of this assignment:

- 1. To communicate with patients and understand the aspects of social pharmacy in designing a pharmaceutical care plan.
- 2. Apply social and behavioural research to understand and improve pharmaceutical care.
- 3. To be able to apply the appropriate behavioral theory to any given disease or condition.

Each student will be required to complete an individual project, involving a patient interview.

- 1. Each student will choose a family member with a certain disease and communicate with the patient through a short interview.
- 2. The student is required to assess the patient and apply the appropriate theory on his case through the following:
 - Assess the patient diseases.

- Choose the appropriate theory that describes the patient beliefs and behavior.
- Describe the factors that affect the pharmaceutical care plan through the chosen theory.
- Recommendation for the patient plan.

A written paper should be handed in the lecture 21, the paper must be typed, double-spaced, 12 font, and one-inch margins or they will not be accepted. Late papers will not be accepted. Students handing in papers late will automatically receive a grade of zero.
