Plural Noun Rules

1. To make regular nouns plural, add -s to the end.

e.g. cat - cats house - houses

2. If the singular noun ends in -s, -ss, -sh, -ch, -x, or -z, add -es to the end.

e.g. bus-buses brush-brushes

lunch-lunches tax-taxes

3. If the noun ends with -f or -fe, the f is often changed to -ve before adding the -s to form the plural

e.g. wife – wives wolf – wolves

**Exceptions: roof-roofs belief - beliefs

chef – chefs chief – chiefs

4. If a singular noun ends in -y and the letter before the -y is a consonant, change the ending to -ies to make the plural.

e.g. city-cities puppy-puppies

5. If the singular noun ends in -y and the letter before the -y is a vowel, simply add an -s to make it plural.

e.g. ray - rays boy - boys

6. If the singular noun ends in -o, add -es to make it plural.

e.g. potato – potatoes tomato – tomatoes

**Exceptions: photo – photos piano – pianos

7. Some nouns don't change at all when they're pluralized.

e.g. sheep – sheep — series — series — species — species — deer –deer

8. Irregular plural:

e.g. child-children goose-geese man-men woman-women tooth-teeth foot-feet

mouse – mice person – people
