## Spelling rules of the third person singular

1. Normally, we add **S** to the end of the verb in the 3rd person (He, She, It).

Verb	3rd Person
talk	Talks
stay	Stays
Give	Give <b>s</b>
like	Likes

- He talks fast.
- She usually stays up late.
- My dog likes my son.
- 2. If the verb ends in SS, X, CH, SH or the letter O, we add + es in the third person. (He, She, It)

Verb	3rd Person
miss	miss <b>es</b>
mix	Mixes
match	matches
wash	wash <b>es</b>
Go	Goes

- She misses her school days.
- The chef **mixes** the ingredients.
- The cleaner washes the dishes.
- 3. If the verb ends in a Consonant + Y, we remove the Y and + ies in the third person (He, She, it).

Verb	3rd Person
Hurry	Hurries
Study	Studies
Cry	Cries
Deny	Den <b>ies</b>

- Ahmad **studies** every morning.
- The baby **cries** all the time.
- The worker **denies** all responsibilities.
